It guarantees equal opportunity for individuals with disabilities in public accommodations, employment, transportation, state and local government services, and telecommunications.

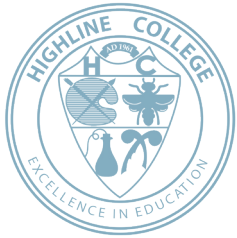

SERVICE OVERVIEW

Access Services' purpose is to seek, cultivate and preserve equal access to educational opportunity for students with disabilities at Highline.

GET STARTED

- Make an appointment with Access Services
- Present formal written documentation of the disability, if available
- Request reasonable accommodations at Highline
- Request services early
- Meet and maintain academic standards

SERVICES PROVIDED

The process of selecting academic adjustments, auxiliary aids, and services (also called accommodations) for each student are made on an individual basis, appropriate to the nature and extent of the disability. Services may consist of one or more of the following examples:

- Testing accommodations
- Sign language interpreting
- Textbooks and materials in alternate format
- Note-taking assistance
- Identifying campus resources
- Use of assistive technology
- Classroom accessibility
- Specialized equipment and furniture
